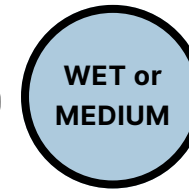


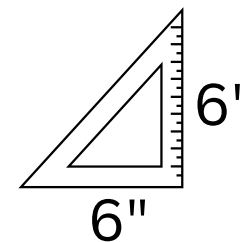
Erythronium americanum

Trout Lily



Spring ephemeral native to moist woodland areas in the Mid-Atlantic. This plant prefers to live under deciduous trees in moist rich humusy soils with good drainage. Once established, **do not move plants.**

Wildlife Value: Native specialist bee, **Trout Lily Miner Bee** aka *Andrena erythronii*, only collects nectar from the Erythronium genus.

Did you know?

The common name comes from the mottled leaves, which look a little like trout. These same camouflaged leaves make it more difficult for deer and other herbivores to find and eat the plants.
