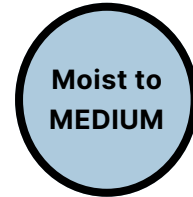
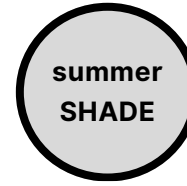


Trillium grandiflorum

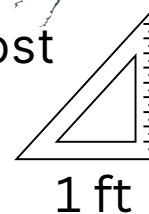
White Trillium



This white 3-petaled flower can turn pale pink as it matures. White Trillium prefers to live under deciduous trees (with summer shade and winter sun) in moist, rich, humusy soils with good drainage. Provide regular watering the first year. Apply leaf mulch in fall. Rhizomatous plant that spreads very gradually if left undisturbed.



Wildlife Value: Trillium species are larval host plants for the Black-patched Clepsid and American Angle Shade moths. The flowers provide nectar for early-emerging native bees.
