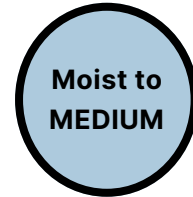
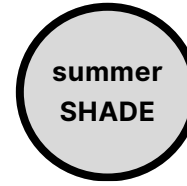


Trillium luteum

Yellow Trillium

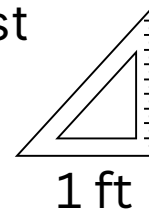


This yellow 3-petaled flower sits directly on its mottled leaves, making it a “sessile” trillium. Yellow Trillium prefers to live under deciduous trees (with summer shade and winter sun) in moist, rich, humusy soils with good drainage.

Native to SE US, Smoky Mountains (not Md.)



Wildlife Value: Trillium species are larval host plants for the Black-patched Clepsid and American Angle Shade moths. The flowers provide nectar for early-emerging native bees.
